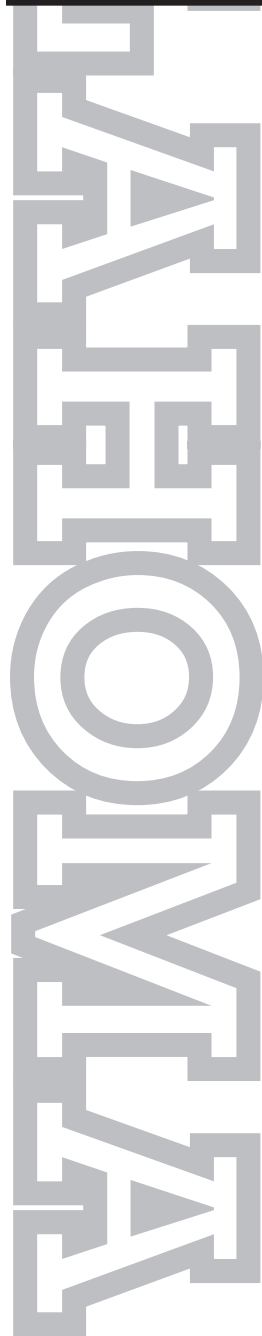




## Campus Profile

### Enrollment

The University of Oklahoma enrolls nearly 30,000 students on its campuses in Norman and Oklahoma City as well as the Schusterman Center in Tulsa. OU also offers courses throughout the state and around the world through the College of Continuing Education.

### Class Size

Beginning this year, all freshman English Composition classes are limited to 19 students. Due to OU's increased private support during the past 12 years, the number of endowed faculty positions has more than quadrupled from 100 to 411. That translates to tremendous faculty support for students.

## Campus Construction

Since 1995, construction projects totaling approximately \$1.5 billion have been completed, are under way, or are upcoming on the Norman Campus. Among the projects are \$111.1 million for student housing residence hall improvements; \$107 million in projects at the Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; \$41.6 million Devon Energy Hall and Rawl Engineering Practice Facility; \$36.8 million Gaylord Hall for the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication; and the \$12 million Lissa and Cy Wagner Student Academic Services Center.

OU's new 271-acre Research Campus is anchored by the Stephenson Research and Technology Center, where cutting-edge research into life science fields ranging from robotics to genomic studies is taking place, and the new \$67 million National Weather Center, which houses OU's academic and research programs in meteorology and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Norman-based weather, research and operations programs.

## Student Life

OU has won awards for new initiatives to create a sense of family and community on campus. OU is one of the very few public universities to twice receive the Templeton Foundation Award as a "Character Building College" for stressing the value of community.

## Student Organizations

OU has something for everyone! The Campus Activities Council, National Society of Collegiate Scholars, Speech & Debate Club, Engineers' Club, and Asian American, American Indian, Latino and Black student associations are just a few of more than 350 student organizations that offer professional, social, recreational and cultural enrichment opportunities. The \$17.8 million renovation of the Norman campus student union includes a student leadership wing, allowing student organizations to have offices side by side and enhancing opportunities for cooperation and teamwork. It is open 24 hours a day.

## Automatic Admissions

Performance requirements for first-time entering freshmen:

### RESIDENT:

Unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale) AND rank in the top 25 percent of high school graduating class

OR ACT score of 24 or higher AND an unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)

OR ACT score of 24 or higher AND rank in the top 50 percent of high school graduating class

OR SAT score of \*1090 or higher AND an unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)

OR SAT score of \*1090 or higher AND rank in the top 50 percent of high school graduating class.

### NON-RESIDENT:

Unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 (on a 4.00 scale) AND rank in the top 25 percent of high school graduating class

OR ACT score of 26 or higher AND an unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)

OR ACT score of 26 or higher AND rank in the top 50 percent of high school graduating class

OR SAT score of \*1170 or higher AND an unweighted cumulative GPA of at least 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)

OR SAT score of \*1170 or higher AND rank in the top 50 percent of high school graduating class.

\*Critical Reading plus Math (the writing portion is not considered for admission)
